Human trafficking is prevalent in the Middle East and North Africa, but remains a taboo subject. Even if a girl manages to escape, she will often be rejected or punished by her family for the perceived shame she has brought on them.

Through Project Rescue, we have been raising awareness of human trafficking and early forced marriage, and have partnered with other charitable organisations who provide compassionate support to girls and their families. Our aim is to shift people's mindsets, particularly in rural communities - to teach them not to treat trafficked women and girls as outcasts, but as victims in need of restoration and love.

Please **pray for the team** as the project gains momentum - due to massive demand on the ground, we are now being requested to expand this project to assist even more women and girls in need across the region. **Please pray too for the women and girls we work with,** that God would bring them healing from their pain and hope for the future.

Thank you so much to those of you who signed up to sponsor a woman through our Blossoms training!

Individual sponsorship of women is already making a real difference to our work. The facilitators of our anti-trafficking curriculum have been able to identify women who are particularly affected by the topics raised, and have recommended them for the Blossoms course to make sure they receive the further emotional support they need and deal with the root of their pain.

For the hundreds of thousands of men, women and children fleeing as refugees from the Middle East, the journey is far from over. Many are now living in refugee camps in Europe and across the Arab world and are vulnerable, traumatized and in need of healing, love and support.

At MEM, we have a wealth of creative media resources and training programmes which we've already used to make a difference to marginalised and hurting people - like the victims of human trafficking, women who have been oppressed and abused, and children who have no idea of their worth. Now we want to adapt these resources to serve refugees. There are countless organisations offering aid to address refugees' physical needs, but we want to go deeper and address the very real emotional and spiritual distress that comes with being forced to flee and live in uncertainty.

Here are just some of the ways our resources can be used to serve refugees:

- Children's educational and inspirational TV shows, for those who receive little or no education in the refugee camps
- Gender-based violence and human trafficking curricula. This is extremely important as female refugees are particularly vulnerable to forced marriage, violence and abduction
- Media therapy, to give people tools to express themselves and find peace after the intense trauma they have been through
- Filmmaking training for young people and children, to give them a creative outlet for their pain, and employable skills for the future.

Pray for Serving Refugees

Renee, our North Africa Director, tells us how we can pray for this project:

"Serving Refugees is a new area that we are stepping into and we are walking totally by faith. We need guidance and discernment to know where to start!

"The Serving Refugees project will put all our existing programmes and training courses at the service of refugees. We also need God's guidance in knowing who to partner with, so that we can use our media resources together with people who are already working in the area to bring hope and deliverance to suffering people. It's very important that we connect with people on the ground to make the project sustainable.

"Our new animated series for children, Life in the Desert, is an integral part of this project. We need the resources to be able to continue production, and we want to look into how best to use Bible stories to bring hope, joy and peace to vulnerable children who are going through pain. We need to pray for anointing for the writers and animators, that the finished episodes will bring life and joy to the viewers.

"We are fairly new to the area of dealing directly with traumatized people, and we recognise that it is only the Spirit of God who can really set captives free. This needs enormous prayer support."

Our Future Leaders training course has been designed to equip young Middle Eastern Christians with the skills and confidence to impart the Good News among their churches and communities in creative ways.

The course combines spiritual leadership and discipleship training with hands-on filmmaking workshops, to empower young Christian leaders to use media to reach out to their communities and to enable the church to meet virtually in times of persecution. By the end of the training, participants are able to create short films on biblical themes and use social media to get their messages across.

Churches throughout the Middle East and North Africa are in desperate need of this training. Following the success of our first courses, *Future Leaders* is now being requested in Iraq, Morocco, Sudan, Lebanon and Egypt. Please pray that we would be resourced to meet the need!

Using media in order to do this is greatly beneficial in that it reaches a plethora of people, more than most other avenues of communication

These films really impacted the Christian students at my university, which made me believe in the power of short films. After the Future Leaders training. I want to write. film and edit in a more professional way.

How to pray for Future Leaders:

- **Thank God** for the passion, talent and potential of the many young Christians who have already undergone the training.
- Pray that the short films our participants have made, and continue to make, will **have real impact** in their communities and churches
- Ask God to provide the resources our team needs to be able to run all the requested courses across the region.

Prayer requests from the Gulf team...

- Please pray for us as we **plan for the next 12 months.** Pray that we would be able to follow God's leadership, and not take on too many side projects which can be a distraction!
- We thank God that one of our **Arabian Dawn** testimonies has now had over 2 million views, after the person who gave his testimony bravely shared the video on his personal Facebook page. Please pray for his safety.
- Thank God for **the impact our work is having in people's lives**. In one of our recent workshops, the participants were working on their final film projects and were talking about role models. Our Christian trainer said that her role model was her mother, because she taught her the meaning of prayer. The Muslim participants were intrigued and asked her how she prayed, and as the trainer explained that she talked to God in times of trouble, fear or doubt, the participants were silent it was clear that God was working in their hearts, as they hadn't ever been exposed to the idea of having a personal relationship with God before. Conversations like these are one of the reasons for our work so Muslim young people can encounter Christians and hear about a different way of living.
