Dear Friends,

It is my great privilege to open this edition and be able to express my deep gratitude for partnering with us. For those who are reading this newsletter for the first time, let me give some background about MEM.

Here in the UK and Europe, we have existed for over 40 years to raise funds for the work that takes place in the Middle East and North Africa, reaching over 20 Arabic-speaking countries. The work, using creative media, seeks to shape people's understanding of democracy and equality, the very principles Jesus radically promoted in his time. We believe our work prepares the ground for good seeds to fall and grow (Luke 8:8).

One of our newest initiatives is Serving Refugees. Whilst the refugee crisis is not the only crisis in the world that currently demands our attention, it is perhaps the most worrying one in its scale and complexity. In the last five years, about 15 conflicts have erupted in the world, resulting in 60 million people becoming refugees—a record number since the end of World War II. Sadly, half of them are children. The UN Refugee Agency reports that globally, one in every 122 humans is now either a refugee, internally displaced, or seeking asylum. These are staggering facts.

Biblical compassion has no boundaries. It cuts through our backgrounds, differences, genders and races. As an organisation, built and operating on Christian values, we want to stand alongside those who are suffering, especially women and children finding themselves trapped in foreign lands. This new project aims to adapt our existing materials such as children's animations, media therapy courses for use in refugee camps, and devising an educational curriculum to equip the trainers working in the area of human trafficking and violence against women.

For this project, we need both your prayers and financial support. I want to take this opportunity to thank our team and some friends for their involvement in the sponsored walk in August, through which we raised almost £6,000 for Serving Refugees. However, we would love to be able to send £10.000 to the field for this project. ANIMATING THE ACTION BIBLE

Bringing God's word to life

The Action Bible is a comic-book style Bible, telling God's story through beautiful, hand-drawn illustrations. Our animation team has now been given the rights to use the artwork from the Action Bible, to produce 66 Bible stories as short, motiongraphic style animations.

With over 1 million copies sold, the Action Bible (www.theactionbible.com) is the perfect Bible for today's visually focused culture. The stories of the Bible have been expertly illustrated by Marvel and DC Comics artist Sergio Cariello, bringing scripture to life through richly colourful, dramatic and energetic artwork

After seeing the high standard of our work, the owners of the Action Bible have given us the rights to produce short animated stories in Arabic using their beautiful artwork.

Each episode will tell a biblical story in around two minutes, such as Adam and Eve or Jesus calming the storm.

The process of turning the comic-book art into animated film is a painstaking task and requires great skill from our animation team in North Africa. Each section of each illustration is digitally separated out and animated individually, to form moving characters, scenes and backgrounds. The result is a beautiful visual effect of illustrations in motion

Our animation team is well known in the region for producing work of exceptional quality, and the Action Bible is no exception! Please pray for the animation team as this project gets underway, as it requires huge amounts of patience, concentration and creativity.

Pray too that once completed, this new series would be a valuable resource for Arabic ministries across the world.

News from the Gulf

FILMING THE I BELIEVE, BUT SERIES



Dearteam,

I'm a 35-year-old man from the Gulf. I decided to follow Jesus three years ago, but of course I have to keep my faith a secret.

As you know, family is very important in our traditions. My family is trying very hard to arrange a bride for me and, to be honest, I want to get married, too. I'm running out of excuses to give to my family as to why I'm refusing all the brides they suggest.

I thought I could just choose someone and get married without telling her about my faith, but then while watching a TV programme I heard them say that a believer marrying an unbeliever is considered a sin.

My question is - why is it a sin? And how can I find a bride who believes in Jesus like me? Do you think there is anyone out there who shares my background and is keeping her new faith a secret too? I have a lot of questions with no answers.

Our I Believe, But project is well underway! Many Christians in the Arabian peninsula, especially those who have converted from Islam, have to keep their faith a secret. This project is designed to support those Christians who can't necessarily go to a church or find others to talk to about their faith in safety. The series answers believers' real questions and struggles, such as the real example from Omar (not his actual name) on the left.

We recently finished filming 10 episodes, and are finishing up another three. We hope that at least 250,000 people view the content over the course of a year.

Please pray for wide viewership and the resources to follow up with those who need further discipleship.



The below script gives a very shortened version of the advice given to Omar in one of the *I Believe, But* episodes. The show's usual format is that a viewer's question is read out, and then the hosts pray and respond from a biblical perspective.

I BELIEVE, BUT... SCRIPT

EPISODE 1
Facing pressure to marry

Omar's question is read out by an actor.

HOST 1: Hi Omar. Your challenge is real and you're not in this alone - there are many other young people in your situation.

Christian marriage is an eternal vow between a man and a woman before God, which turns two people into one. This doesn't they both have Christ in their hearts. Faith has to be the truly possible. That is why we believe that it isn't ideal to marry someone from another faith.

HOST 2: Families mean well when they pressure their children to marry, so don't blame them, but don't let this pressure get to you. Try to gently but firmly communicate to them that you refuse to get married until you find the woman that meets your standards.

HOST 1: It might be difficult to find a believing woman from our Gulf background – you will have to search hard. You may have to ask someone you trust to help you, as like you, they might will guide you.

I encourage you to pray a lot, commit to having a biblical marriage and wait on the Lord. Trust that God's timing is perfect, and that He wants what is best for you!

We'll continue to pray for you and we hope to hear back from you. God be with you all.
